12. INTERRUPTION OF BUSINESS FOR PRONOUNCEMENT OF THE BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS AND REVENUE RAISING MEASURES FOR THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2025/2026

"Honourable Members, section 40 of the Public Finance Management Act, Cap.412A, and Standing Order 244(C) require the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury and Economic Planning to make a public pronouncement on the budget policy highlights and revenue-raising measures for the national government each financial year.

Pursuant to the said provisions, I will shortly interrupt the business of the House to allow the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury and Economic Planning to make a public pronouncement on the Budget Highlights and Revenue Raising Measures for the National Government for the Financial Year 2025/2026 and the Medium Term. In accordance with the Standing Orders, I have also designated a suitable place in the Chamber for that purpose.

Honourable Members, as we welcome the Cabinet Secretary to the National Assembly, I wish to remind the House that today's event is largely ceremonial. No decision will be required on the speech as the *Supply Period*, which commences with the consideration of the Budget Estimates and concludes with the enactment of an Appropriation Act, is still ongoing.

Having said that, **Honourable Members**, and before we proceed, I take this opportunity to acknowledge and recognise the presence of distinguished guests in the galleries of the House today. They include members of the Cabinet, Principal Secretaries, Chairpersons and Chief Executive Officers of various parastatals, senior government officials, members of the diplomatic corps, and development partners.

Honourable Members, I also wish to recognize and appreciate the presence of university student leaders and their colleagues from our universities across the country; members of **Bunge la Wananchi**; representatives of various **youth and women groups**; a group of traders representing a cross-section of our small-scale business community including **boda boda** riders who are with us today.

On behalf of the National Assembly and on my own behalf, I welcome all of you to the National Assembly.

Before I invite the Cabinet Secretary to make the pronouncement, I wish to remind the House that in accordance with the provisions of Standing Order 244(C)(3), the Cabinet Secretary shall be **heard in silence** without question or clarification being sought.

Honourable Members, I now interrupt the business of the House to allow the Cabinet Secretary to make a public pronouncement on the budget policy highlights and revenue-raising measures for the national government for the financial year 2025/2026. The **Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury & Economic**
