8. QUESTIONS & STATEMENTS

a) Statement pursuant to Standing Order 52 (1)

Nominated Senator Hamida Kibwana made a statement on the growing crisis of unintended pregnancies and unsafe abortions in Kenya.

In the statement, the Senator attributed the problem of unintended pregnancies and unsafe abortions in Kenya to ineffective contraception and inadequate reproductive healthcare services. Citing a 2023 study by the Africa Population and Health Research Centre and the Ministry of Health, the Senator revealed that Kenya recorded over 1.4 million unintended pregnancies and nearly 794,000 abortions, with the highest rates in Nairobi and Central Kenya. The Senator highlighted concerns over the effectiveness and proper use of emergency contraceptives, noting that 35% of users conceived. She also emphasized the need to address persistence of stigma around contraception, especially affecting young and married women, many of whom already have children.

The Senator was further concerned that there were critical gaps in postabortion care, with a majority of health facilities lacking basic services. The Senator Concluded by calling upon on the Standing Committee on Health to investigate the quality and availability of contraceptives and to promote public education to reduce stigma, and strengthen postabortion care.
