"PURSUANT to the provisions of Standing Order 41(1) and 142 of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I hereby convey the following Message from the National Assembly-

WHEREAS, the Division of Revenue Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 10 of 2025) was published vide Kenya Gazette Supplement No. 38 of 12th March 2025 to provide for the equitable division of revenue raised

nationally between the national and county governments in the 2025/2026 financial year,

AND WHEREAS, the National Assembly considered the said Bill and passed it without amendments on Wednesday, 9th April 2025 in the form attached hereto:

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Article 110(4) of the Constitution and Standing Orders 41 and 142 of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I hereby refer the Bill to the Senate for consideration."

The Senator also affirmed her continued support for KEWOSA as Chairperson Emeritus and pledged to uphold the association's ideals. She urged her fellow women senators to stay united and continue advocating for women's rights and empowerment across the country.
