- 1. The House assembled at Thirty Minutes past Two O'clock.
- **2.** The Proceedings were opened with Prayer.
- 3. **Presiding –** the Honourable Speaker.

4. COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR

The Speaker issued the following Communication-

<u>Consideration of the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill (National Assembly Bill</u> <u>No. 4 of 2025)</u>

"Honourable Members, you may recall that the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 4 of 2025) was read a First Time in this House on Wednesday, 12th March 2025, following which I referred it to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for consideration, public participation and reporting to the House.

The Bill, which is co-sponsored by the Hon. Samuel Chepkong'a, CBS, MP, and the Hon. (Dr.) Otiende Amollo, SC, CBS, MP, was published in the Kenya *Gazette* supplement on 26^{th} February 2025 and seeks to amend the Constitution to entrench the following Funds—

- (i) The **National Government Constituencies Fund** for purposes of ensuring reasonable access to exclusive national government functions in all constituencies as envisaged in Article 6(3) and guaranteeing the participation of the people in the identification and implementation of priority national government programmes;
- (ii) The **Senate Oversight Fund** to ensure that the Senate is adequately empowered and resourced to perform its oversight functions; and
- (iii) The **National Government Affirmative Action Fund** to enhance the national government's measures on affirmative action.

Honourable Members, the Committee concluded the public participation exercise, tabled its Report on 17th June 2025, and the Bill is now in Second Reading as listed Order Paper. Before the House resumes debate this afternoon, I wish to highlight the procedural aspects related to the consideration of Bills to amend the Constitution through parliamentary initiative.

Honourable Members, with respect to the manner of debating the Bill, I note that debate on a Bill to amend the Constitution is not subject to curtailments contemplated under Standing Orders 95 (*Closure of debate*) and 97 (*Limitation of debate*). In this regard, neither

a Motion seeking that *the Mover be called upon to reply*, nor a Motion to limit debate on the Bill shall be entertained.

Honourable Members, on voting thresholds, Article 256 of the Constitution prescribes the threshold for passage of a Bill to amend the Constitution, both at the Second and Third Readings. For emphasis, it provides as follows, and I quote —

256. (1) A Bill to amend this Constitution—

(a).....; (b).....; (c).....; and

(d)shall have been passed by Parliament when each House of Parliament has passed the Bill, in both its second and third readings, <u>by not less than two-thirds of</u> <u>all the members of that House.</u>

In this regard, the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill, 2025 will stand passed at Second Reading if it garners the support of **not less than 233 Members** of this House, being **at least two-thirds** of the Members of the National Assembly. This threshold will also apply to the vote at the Third Reading. Barring this threshold at either of the two stages, the Bill will have been lost.

Honourable Members, upon conclusion of debate at the Second Reading stage, the House shall proceed to vote. Should the vote on the Bill meet the constitutional threshold, the House shall proceed to Committee of the whole House as indicated in the Supplementary Order Paper. Thereafter, the House shall take a vote on the Third Reading stage of the Bill.

Having said that, **Honourable Members**, I wish to notify the House that I have received representations from four Members who indicate that they are indisposed. Indeed, our records indicate that the four Members have been indisposed and have been on rest or recuperation with the consent of Mr. Speaker and the respective doctors. In this regard, they will be allowed to vote virtually. The Members are-

- (a) The Hon. Catherine Wambilianga, MP Member for Bungoma County;
- (b) The Hon. Clement Sloya, MP Member for Sabatia;
- (c) The Hon. Joseph Samal, MP Member for Isiolo North; and
- (d) The Hon. Abraham Kirwa, MP Member for Mosop.

Honourable Members, Standing Order 62 grants latitude to the Speaker to direct a further vote in the event that any Question requiring a fixed majority is carried but fails to meet the two-thirds majority at the first instance. Standing Order 62(2) provides that, and I quote —

"(2) whenever a Bill or a special Motion the passage of which requires a special majority in the Assembly fails to obtain the required majority and the vote results in a majority of the "Ayes" but the "Noes" have not numbered at least one third of all the Members of the Assembly, the Speaker may direct that a further vote be taken on the particular question, and the further vote shall be taken <u>within five sitting days</u> from the day the first vote was taken or such other time as the Speaker may determine.

(3) If the Speaker does not so direct any further vote, or if on such further vote the fixed majority is not obtained, the Speaker shall declare that the Motion is negatived."

In this regard, **Honourable Members,** should it become necessary to invoke the provisions of Standing Order 62(2) either at the Second Reading or Third Reading of the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill, 2025, I will guide the House accordingly.

As a matter of fact, a precedent was set in 2016 when the then Speaker directed a further vote on the Motion for Second Reading of the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) (No. 4) Bill, 2015 to be taken on 5th May 2016. The Bill, which sought to incorporate the two-thirds

gender principle, had not met the two-thirds constitutional threshold at the first attempt on 27th April 2016.

Honourable Members, once this House passes the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill, 2025, I will refer it to the Senate for consideration.

Having said that, **Honourable Members**, I wish to clarify to the House and indeed the general public that, the procedure for consideration and passage of Bills to amend the Constitution, as set out in Article 256, <u>does not contemplate amendments to the Bill</u> at the Committee of the whole House stage. The House is accordingly guided. I thank you!"

5. <u>MESSAGES</u>

The Speaker conveyed the following Message-

Referral by His Excellency the President of two (2) National Assembly Bills

"Honourable Members, Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 42, I wish to report to the House that I have received two (2) Messages from His Excellency the President, regarding the referral of the National Land Commission (Amendment) Bill, 2023; and the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022) to Parliament for reconsideration.

Honourable Members, in the **Messages**, His Excellency the President conveys that pursuant to the provisions of Article 115(1)(b) of the Constitution, he has considered the National Land Commission (Amendment) Bill, 2023 and referred it back to the National Assembly for reconsideration, expressing reservations on **Clauses 2** and **3** of the Bill. Additionally, His Excellency the Presidential has expressed reservations on **Clauses 2**, **3** and **4** of the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022).

His Excellency the President has detailed the reasons for his Reservations on the Bills and made recommendations thereof for consideration by the National Assembly and Houses of Parliament respectively. His Excellency the President now requests Parliament to reconsider the Bills in accordance with the provisions of Article 115 of the Constitution.

Honourable Members, you may recall that this House passed the National Land Commission (Amendment) Bill, 2023 on 13th March 2025, following which I presented the Bill to His Excellency the President for assent in accordance with the provisions of Article 115 the Constitution. Similarly, the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022) was passed by the Houses of Parliament on 15th April 2024 and thereafter submitted to His Excellency the President for assent in accordance with the provisions of Article 112(2)(a) of the Constitution.

Honourable Members, the House is required to consider the President's Reservations to the specified clauses in respect of each Bill. Standing Order 154(2) requires the House to consider the President's Reservations **within twenty-one (21) days** upon receipt of the Memorandum.

In this regard, **Honourable Members**, with respect to the President's Reservations to the National Lands Commission (Amendment) Bill, 2023, the Message from the His Excellency the President, together with the Memorandum, are hereby referred to the Departmental Committee on Lands for consideration and reporting. The Memorandum to the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022)

together with the Message from His Excellency the President, are hereby referred to the Departmental Committee on Health.

The Committees should prioritise the Bills and table their reports to allow this House to consider the President's Reservations within the statutory timelines. Upon conclusion of

consideration of the President's Reservations to the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022), I will transmit the decision of the National Assembly to the Senate for reconsideration.

Honourable Members, I hasten to guide the House that the consideration of the President's Reservations to the Bills by the respective Committees and the House will be undertaken in accordance with the provisions of Article 115 of the Constitution. Further, the guidance contained in the *Speaker's Communication* of 28th July 2015 relating to the *Consideration of the President's Reservations to a Bill and amendments thereto* will apply, as shall be necessary.

Honourable Members, I now direct the Clerk to circulate the Memoranda of His Excellency the President on the two Bills to all Members. The House is accordingly informed. **I thank you!**"
