I. <u>THE AIR PASSENGER SERVICE CHARGE</u> (AMENDMENT) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 35 OF 2025)

(i) Notice is given that the Leader of the Majority Party intends to move the following amendments to the Air Passenger Service Charge (Amendment) Bill, 2025 at the Committee stage—

CLAUSE 2

THAT, Clause 2 be deleted and replaced with the following new clause—

Amendment of section 3 of Cap. 475.

- **2.** Section 3 of the Air Passenger Service Charge Act is amended in sub-section (3) by deleting the expression "Tourism Promotion Fund" and substituting therefor the expression "Tourism Fund".
- (ii) Notice is given that the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Transport and Infrastructure intends to move the following amendments to the Air Passenger Service Charge (Amendment) Bill, 2025 at the Committee stage—

CLAUSE 2

THAT, Clause 2 of the Bill be amended in the proposed new subsection (3), by deleting the words "the Tourism Fund and the Kenya Meteorological Service Authority" and substituting therefor the words "and the Tourism Fund."

(iii) Notice is given that the Member for Kiambaa (Hon. John Wanjiku) intends to move the following amendments to the Air Passenger Service Charge (Amendment) Bill, 2025 at the Committee stage—

CLAUSE 2

THAT, Clause 2 be deleted and replaced with the following new clause—

Amendment of section 3 of Cap. 475.

- 2. Section 3 of the Air Passenger Service Charge Act is amended—
- (a) in sub-section (3), by inserting the expression "the Tourism Fund" immediately after the expression "Kenya Civil Aviation Authority";
- (b) by inserting the following new sub-section immediately after sub-section (3)—
- "(4) The apportionment of proceeds under sub-section (3) to the Tourism Promotion Fund shall lapse upon expiry of two years from the date of commencement of this provision, but the Cabinet Secretary may, from time to time, by notice in the Gazette, extend that time for a further period not exceeding two years for any particular extension."

(Subject to Article 114 of the Constitution)

LIMITATION OF DEBATE

The House resolved on Thursday, February 13, 2025 as follows—

Limitation of Debate on Motions

THAT, each speech in a debate on any Motion, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner: A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.

Limitation of Debate on Bills sponsored by Parties or Committees

THAT, each speech in a debate on Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party shall be limited as follows:

A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.

Limitation of Debate on Individual Members' Bills

IV. THAT, each speech in a debate on Bills NOT sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party shall be limited as follows: A maximum of three hours and thirty minutes, with not more than thirty (30) minutes for the Mover, in moving and ten (10) minutes in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen minutes (15) each; and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.

V. THAT, each speech in debate on Reports of Audit Committees shall be limited as follows: A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.
