1. The Senate assembled at thirty Minutes past Two O'clock.
2. The proceedings were opened with Prayer said by the Deputy Speaker.

5. **MESSAGE FROM THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY ON THE PASSAGE OF THE COUNTY ALLOCATION OF REVENUE BILL (SENATE BILLS NO. 9 OF 2025)**

The Deputy Speaker conveyed the following Message from the National Assembly:

“Honourable Senators,

I wish to report to the Senate that, pursuant to Standing Order 46 (3) & (4) of the Senate Standing Orders, I received the following Message from the Speaker of the National Assembly regarding the passage by the National Assembly of the County Allocation of Revenue Bill (Senate Bills No.9 of 2025).

The Message, which is dated Thursday, 7th August, 2025, was received in the Office of the Clerk of the Senate on the same date.

Pursuant to the said Standing Order, I now report the Message –

“PURSUANT to the provisions of Standing Order 41(1) and 144 of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I hereby convey the following Message from the National Assembly-

WHEREAS, the County Allocation of Revenue Bill (Senate Bills No. 9 of 2025) was passed by the Senate on Tuesday, 22nd July 2025 and referred to the National Assembly for consideration pursuant to the provisions of Article 110(4) of the Constitution;

AND WHEREAS, the National Assembly considered and passed the Bill without amendments and in the form passed by the Senate, on Wednesday, 6th August 2025;

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Article 110 of the Constitution and Standing Orders 41 and 144 of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I hereby convey the said decision of the National Assembly to the Senate.”

Honourable Senators,

Article 110 (5) of the Constitution provides that, once a Bill concerning counties has been passed by both Houses in the same form, the Speaker of the House in which the Bill originated shall refer the Bill to the President for assent.

Accordingly, I am in the process of referring the County Allocation of Revenue Bill (Senate Bills No.9 of 2025) to His Excellency the President for assent.

7. QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS**a) Statements pursuant to Standing Order 52 (1)**

- i.) The Senator for Samburu County (Sen. (Dr.) Lelegwe Ltumbesi, MP) made a Statement regarding the death of Baby Nareu Lelkaja and the shameful state of healthcare services in Samburu County.

In the statement, the Senator called for a comprehensive and urgent inquiry into the operations of Samburu County Referral Hospital and the

broader health budget implementation by the county administration. He recounted the heartbreaking story of Baby Nareu Lekalja, a 4-year-old girl from Tamiyoi village who died while in transit to seek medical attention in another facility. He stated that the Samburu County Referral Hospital was plagued by negligence, incompetence, and a lack of urgency in discharging healthcare services, further, highlighting that the hospital lacked basic diagnostic tools and functional equipment. This forced the family of the baby to seek healthcare services elsewhere.

The Senator described the tragedy as not just a medical failure but a betrayal of public trust, accusing the county leadership of diverting public funds meant for health and essential services into non-essential, cosmetic activities while patients suffer from preventable diseases. He noted that families have been forced to endure indignities, including transporting critically ill or deceased loved ones using public means.

The Senator concluded by calling for accountability, naming of those responsible, and urgent reforms to restore dignity to healthcare in Samburu County. The Senator pledged to ensure that justice is pursued for Baby Nareu and every other family that has suffered due to the county's failed health system, insisting that leadership must reflect the ability to protect and preserve life above all else.

- ii.) Nominated Senator (Sen. Betty Montet, MP) made a Statement regarding the Cabinet ratification of the transfer of Amboseli National Park to the County Government of Kajiado, fulfilling a Presidential directive following a petition by Kajiado County.

In the Statement, the Senator expressed her heartfelt gratitude, on behalf of Kajiado County leadership and residents, to His Excellency the President for honouring this long-standing promise to transfer management of Amboseli National Park to Kajiado County. She noted that this historic decision marked a significant milestone for Kajiado County, as Amboseli National Park, world-renowned for its large elephant herds and stunning views of Mt. Kilimanjaro, was an integral part of the County's heritage and a critical component of an 8,000 square kilometre ecosystem between Kenya and Tanzania.

She highlighted that the transfer of the National Park would bring numerous benefits to the local community, including job creation, improved infrastructure, educational scholarships, better healthcare services, and greater access to clean water. She added that the expansion of community-owned wildlife conservancies would further generate income through land leases and eco-tourism. However, she also cautioned that challenges such as human-wildlife conflict, land sub-division disrupting migration corridors, drought-induced resource scarcity, and poaching could undermine the park's long-term sustainability and called on the National and County governments to address these challenges.
