5. QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS

(a) Statements pursuant to Standing Order 52 (1)

- i. Nominated Senator (Sen. Hezena Lemaletian, MP) made a Statement regarding deteriorating security situation in Baragoi and its environs in Samburu County.

Thereupon, the Senator informed the Senate that escalating insecurity in Baragoi, Samburu County has instilled fear, anger, and uncertainty among residents, following repeated killings including the fatal shooting of a member of the *Lesepe* family and the earlier killing of a young man from the *Loorubat* family.

She noted that these tragic events have left Baragoi tense, with restricted movement and growing apprehension of revenge and counter-revenge attacks that threaten to escalate into wider instability.

Further, the Senator stated that the situation in Naisiisho (Nyiro) area, Loirrikan (Moriyo), and Suyian in Angata Nanyekia ward remains volatile, with pastoralists, women, and children at imminent risk of bandit attacks. He observed that the recurring cycle of killings and banditry continues to destabilize Samburu County, disrupt livelihoods, and erode public confidence in the Government's ability to provide security and protect its citizens.

The Senator called upon the national Government, through the Ministry of Interior and National Administration, to urgently restore calm, prevent retaliatory violence, deploy adequate security personnel, and apprehend and prosecute those responsible for the heinous acts.

In conclusion, he emphasized that swift and firm intervention is the only way to break the cycle of violence and restore lasting peace and stability in Baragoi and Samburu County at large.

- ii. Seneta wa Kaunti ya Mombasa (Sen. Mohammed Faki, Mbunge) alitoa kauli kuhusu kuanza kwa mwezi mtukufu wa Ramadhani tarehe 18 mwezi wa Februari, 2026 kwa baadhi ya waislamu, na tarehe 19 mwezi

wa Februari, 2026 kwa waislamu wengine wote nchini na ulimwenguni.

Hapo Seneta aliieleza Seneti kwamba Ramadhani, mwezi wa tisa katika kalenda ya Kiislamu, umeanza kwa Waislamu nchini na duniani, na ni kipindi cha kufunga kwa siku 29 au 30, kujinyima chakula na starehe, kuwalisha maskini, na kushiriki ibada mbalimbali kama ilivyoamrisha katika *Quran* Tukufu.

Zaidi, Seneta alibainisha kuwa Waislamu hushiriki ibada za usiku ikiwemo swala ya taraweh, na hivyo huhitaji usalama wa kutosha wanapoenda na kutoka misikitini. Aidha, alisisitiza haja ya kuhakikisha upatikanaji wa maji na umeme, hususan katika kaunti ya Mombasa ambao zimekumbwa na uhaba wa huduma hio.

Seneta aliongeza kuwa Ramadhani ya mwaka huu inakwenda sambamba na msimu wa Kwaresma kwa Wakatoliki, ambao pia hufunga na kujinyima ili kuwa karibu na Mwenyezi Mungu.

Kwa hitimisho, Seneta aliwatakia Waislamu wote Ramadhan Mubarak, Swaum Maqbul na dua zenye kukubaliwa, na akawatakia Wakatoliki Kwaresma yenye baraka na fanaka.

- iii. The Senator for Kitui County (Sen. Enoch Wambua, MP) made a Statement regarding illegal, dangerous, unregulated and unsustainable sand harvesting and degradation of riverbeds in Kitui County.

Thereupon, the Senator informed the Senate that rampant sand harvesting in Kitui has accelerated desertification, undermined livelihoods, degraded ecosystems, and exposed residents to grave socio-economic and security risks. She noted that after deforestation and charcoal trade devastated forest cover, destruction has now shifted to rivers, the lifelines of water, agriculture, and resilience in the arid county.

Further, the Senator stated that oversight inquiries revealed industrial-scale extraction, with nearly 100 trucks counted in a single day on one route, contradicting official claims of “a few trucks.” He raised concerns about governance failures, including lack of a credible truck register, axle-load violations destroying roads, revenue leakages linked to cartels, and failure to allocate funds for river restoration despite worsening degradation.

The Senator further observed that the devastation has spawned serious social harms, including dust pollution, accidents, teenage pregnancies, school dropouts, HIV infections, and cartel-linked violence, with reports of armed gangs attacking residents around sand sites. He emphasized that laws without enforcement have become

ineffective, with NEMA and other institutions failing to act, and even a valid court order halting sand harvesting being openly defied.

He called upon the Senate to urgently intervene by requiring accountability from the Kitui County Executive on enforcement, truck registration, and revenue safeguards from national security agencies on cartel violence; from NEMA on environmental protection; and from the Nguni Police Station on compliance with the court order.

In conclusion, the Senator urged the Senate to consider an official visit to affected rivers in Kitui to witness the scale of destruction and institutional failure. He stressed that the question is not whether sand is valuable, but whether greed, cartels, and weak enforcement will be allowed to destroy the future of Kitui County.
