1. The House assembled at Thirty Minutes past Two O'clock.
2. The Proceedings were opened with Prayer.
3. **Presiding** – the Honourable Speaker.

4. **QUORUM AT COMMENCEMENT OF THE HOUSE**

There being no Quorum present at the commencement of the House, the Speaker ordered the Quorum bell to be rung for ten minutes;

And Quorum having been attained within ten minutes, business commenced.

5. **COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR**

The Speaker issued the following Communications—

(i) **On the election of the Hon. Rahab Mukami, MP as President of the Women's Caucus of the Pan-African Parliament (PAP)**

“Honourable Members, I wish to inform the House that during the Extraordinary Session of the Pan-African Parliament held in May 2026 in Midrand, Republic of South Africa, the Hon. Rahab Mukami, MP, a Member of the Pan African Parliament and who is also the Member for Nyeri County, was elected as President of the Women's Caucus of the Pan-African Parliament for a three-year term.

The Women's Caucus is established under the Rules of Procedure of the Pan-African Parliament to advocate for gender equality, women's empowerment, and the integration of gender-sensitive legislation across the African continent.

Honourable Members, this position represents not only a significant honour to the Member, but more importantly, a proud moment for the Republic of Kenya and a testament to the unwavering commitment of our nation to advancing women's leadership on the continental stage. Her election therefore places Kenya at the helm of this important continental body and is a significant recognition of Kenya's continued commitment to promoting women's leadership and inclusive governance at the continental level.

It also provides an opportunity to strengthen the Caucus's role in advancing policies that enhance women's participation in decision-making, promote economic empowerment, and foster equal representation in governance and development across Africa.

Honourable Members, on my own behalf and that of the House, I extend our warmest congratulations to the Hon. Rahab Mukami on her well-deserved election. I am confident that she will discharge her responsibilities with distinction and enhance Kenya's contribution to parliamentary diplomacy and continental cooperation. I urge

all Honourable Members to accord her their full support as she undertakes this important responsibility. **I thank you!"**

(ii) On the Outcome of Harmonisation of Proposed Amendments to the Sovereign Wealth Fund Bill, 2026

"Honourable Members, You will recall that during the afternoon Sitting of yesterday, Wednesday 1st July 2026, I referred proposed amendments to the Sovereign Wealth Fund Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 7 of 2026) to a *winnowing* process before the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning, in accordance with Standing Order 131.

I also directed the Committee to undertake the exercise and update my Office not later than 10.00 am today, Thursday, 2nd July 2026, so as to guide on the next steps with regard to the processing of the Bill in the Committee of the Whole House.

Honourable Members, I wish to inform the House that I have since received, and approved for tabling, the Report of the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning on the harmonisation of proposed amendments to the Sovereign Wealth Fund Bill, 2026.

I have already allowed the Chairperson of the Committee to table the Report at Order Number 5.

The Report indicates that Members who had proposed amendments to the Bill, namely, **the Hon. Caroli Omondi, MP; the Hon. John Kaguchia, MP; the Hon. (Dr.) Wilberforce Oundo, MP; the Hon. Mark Mwenje, CBS, MP; the Hon. Justice Kemei, MP; the Hon. Robert Mbui, CBS, MP; and the Hon. Gitonga Mukunji, MP,** participated in the *winnowing* process. The Leader of the Majority Party also participated in the process.

I wish to commend Committee for expertly shepherding the harmonisation process. I also commend the **Leader of the Majority Party and the seven Members** who had proposed amendments to the Bill for appearing before the Committee to prosecute them.

Honourable Members, I have confirmed that following consultations, all Members yielded their proposals to be taken up by the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning.

Notably, the Member for Suba South, Hon. Caroli Omondi, MP who had proposed the deletion of all the clauses of the Bill, which would have resulted to defeat of the Bill in its entirety, found it appropriate to abandon that course. The import of his proposals would have amounted to *throwing away the baby with the bath water*.

Honourable Members, given the consensus, I approved publication of a Supplementary Order Paper for today's Sitting to include the harmonised proposed amendments to the Sovereign Wealth Fund Bill, 2026.

You will note that the proposed amendments are now in the name of the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning. The amendments will therefore be prosecuted in the usual manner in the Committee of the whole House under Order No. 13. The House is accordingly guided. **I thank you!"**
